I also sailed a US 1M, Marblehead, CR914, ODOM, and AC (Americas Cup) over the years. In 2012 Bob Wells introduced me to the IOM class and let me sail his V-6. I was hooked! I ended up buying a Topiko from Bob. I sailed a V-8 next, and currently sail a V-10 with which I won the Canadian Nationals in 2017.

We moved to Bellingham in 2014, and I have been sailing my IOM regularly with the DPMYC since then. Our current venue at Bowman Bay is the best venue I have ever sailed on, has a good group of sailors, and has grown over the years to a fine club.
