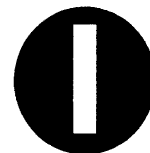




2016 IOM Canadian National Championship
Notice of Race
3 – 5 June, 2016 – Saltspring Island, British Columbia



- 1. Event:** The WCMYA and Saltspring Island Sailing Club (SISC) invite International One Metre (I.O.M.) sailors to the 2016 I.O.M. Canadian National Championship Regatta at SISC on Saltspring Island, British Columbia, Canada.
- 2. Eligibility:** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the Equipment Rules of Sailing, the IOM class rules and HMS (2014)
- Entrants must be current members of the CRYA, or their National Authority. Yachts must comply with the IOMICA rules as approved by the IRSA and have a valid measurement certificate. Proof of membership and Measurement Certificate may accompany entry or be presented at, or by, check-in. Event measurement will be available on 2nd June, all day.
- 3. Entry:** **Entry fee is \$65**, and includes lunch on the 3rd, 4th and 5th June, Barbeque on the 4th. Please make cheques payable to - Saltspring Island Sailing Club.
- Entries must be received no later than **6th May, 2016**. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Regatta Chairman. **Late Entry fee will be \$70.**
- Additional lunch and barbeque tickets for those accompanying entrants will be \$20
- Sail number conflicts will be resolved based on the date of receipt of paid entries including those accepted after the entry deadline.
- 4. Accommodation** Entrants have a range of accommodation from which to choose. There are a limited number of billets. For more information, contact Lawrie Neish, Regatta Chair at (250) 537-2053 or by e-mail wneish@shaw.ca. Saltspring Island has a variety of hotel, motel and Bed 'n Breakfast accommodation. It should be noted that the Island is a popular destination and accommodation should be booked well ahead, as should ferry travel. Limited camping, tent or camper, is allowed in the grounds and docking is available for those who may arrive by boat.

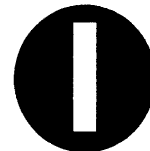

Practice and tuning races - 1 pm onwards

Friday 3rd June -

Check in and measuring 8.30 to 9.30 am

Skippers meeting – 10 am with photo session to follow

Seeding Races – 10.30 am.

Racing commences immediately after the race committee posts heat divisions.

Lunch - 12 noon – 1 pm approximately

Racing continues - 1 pm - 4.30 pm

No Host dinner – 6.30 pm at Saltspring Inn

Saturday 4th June

Skippers to be available to race at 9 am

Lunch – 12 noon to 1pm approximately

Racing continues 1 pm to 4.30 pm.

Skippers to be available to race at 9 am

Racing - 9 am to 1 pm

Lunch and awards 1 pm until 3 pm

This is tentative - I would appreciate skippers advising me if they have any problems with the beginning and ending timings and their travel and accommodation arrangements.

Requirements

Membership of the CRYA is required for Canadians Nationals. For non-Canadians, membership of their national authority is required. (AMYA for USA)

All boats must have valid certificates.

The Saltspring Inn would also like to know if you have any diet restrictions etc. and they will attempt to accommodate them

Travel

Many of you have been here before, but!

Check BC Ferries on line for schedules and the bottom of their website screen for any problems.

Skippers from Vancouver Island who plan to arrive on the Friday morning should be aware of BC ferry schedules.

The 9 am from Swartz Bay to Fulford Harbour would normally get you to SISC around 9.50 am. It may be running late due to loading at Swartz Bay. There is an earlier ferry

The Crofton to Vesuvius Bay ferry notoriously has delays. You should plan accordingly. It is about 20 minute from Vesuvius Bay to SISC

Travelers arriving from the Mainland via Tsawwassen can travel direct to Saltspring (Long Harbour) or may travel via Swartz Bay then to Fulford Harbour. This latter route is slightly quicker and allows travel in the hours between the direct ferry sailings but you are not guaranteed a connection. This route also requires that you leave the Swartz Bay terminal and re-enter for Saltspring. Buy a through ticket to Saltspring Island at Tsawwassen terminal.

BC Ferries collect the return fares at Swartz Bay and Crofton, no fares are collected at Saltspring when leaving.
