## Seattle MYC Regatta #4 – IOM Fleet (June 26th @ Coulon Park)

Summer is finally officially here and we sailed in sun and mild temps. The night before the regatta the forecast improved to a nice southerly with a low chance of rain. In the morning the forecast flipped for the regatta to N and later NW wind in the mid 1-rig range with no rain, and that held. After a nice solid wind for prerace practice, we had some light wind stretches early. In the end it was another great day of sailing at Coulon Park. Post sailing most of us lunched on Mexican food at Torreros, and we will return there after the next races by popular demand.

Jerry again called the wind direction correctly when he placed an array of three buoys for weather and offset marks to accommodate wind shifts, and we used them all. We have more buoys now and he also placed separate finish and start lines, which allows longer windward legs at the start and finish. In the afternoon the wind went more westerly and the buoys weren't adjusted. This left the start line port biased and going to weather was mostly on port. Sailing to weather on port was bouncy, but it was the much longer hypotenuse to the waves so it was the fast tack by far. On the long weather legs staying away from the dock was faster too, and choosing the best time to tack away from the dock provided gains. Making good tacks in the deep chop provided gains too, as you want to avoid smooth non-aggressive tacks (wallowing in irons is painfully slow, don't ask... and don't look at my last three race scores). Port starts at the favored west end were all but impossible, but the best starters were on the line at this far pin, and tacked on port at the gun. I was impressed with how quickly the fleet figured this out. A few years ago this would have taken longer, so it speaks to our collective improvement. The problem here is we are all improving, so it doesn't feel like you are personally.

Once again Kelly was Kelly, as he ran away with another regatta. In the past I felt he didn't point well with his V8 when the wind was up, well that is the past. Now he is higher and faster with the best of us in the stronger winds and chop. Couple that with a good start almost every race and downwind speed, and he is formidable. Upwind Kelly sailed with less jib twist than most of us and his main was dropped off centerline. In the front where Kelly resides it is easy to look good if you can get there. Back in the congested pack is the most challenging sailing in our club, and where most of us play.

Our newest member, Dick Dyer, volunteered to call the line and record the scores, and he picked a great day to join us. If your boat isn't ready to sail, this is the next best option to join us. He also brought his recently received new MX-16 hull for some advice on the 1/2" crack under the post on the hull bottom. It appears to be in the paint and non-structural. Otherwise a nice looking boat build by Thai Safepack.
