Here's the profile view with emerging chine at stern. No deck patches on foredeck – very unlike SAILSetc's normal practice. I don't know why the Kantun S fin/bulb (by Craig Smith) is leaning on it?



Some bow flair, but no chine at the bow or amidships per current fashion...



Some foredeck flair too, but not beamy like a Pikanto... Nothing extreme on the deck... Pikantoesque stern though...

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Answer: It is the cleverly named AKZIOM (or AKZ) built by Aussie Tim Brown of Radio Race Yachts in QLD. Construction is clearly not a hatchet job. Now I know why no deck patches on the foredeck. We'll see Tim and Elaine at US Nats in San Diego, and we can talk about his new boat with him there... FYI the Aussie \$ is low... AKZIOM: A new design commissioned by Radio Race Yachts with input from Tim Brown. This is a much revised and developed version of PIKANTO incorporating feedback from Ante Kovacevic in light of his continued experiments with that design which have changed the hull overall beam considerably. Ante firmly believes the narrower hull forms are not capable of surfing downwind in heavy conditions as well as the earlier more moderate beamed boats are. And Tim has found a strong preference for the Pikanto design amongst sailors local to him who are used to sailing in stronger winds. The plug was CNC cut and finished by Craig Smith.
