2024 Gig Harbor MYC Regatta #1 – IOM Class (March 9th at Surprise Lake, Milton, WA) Bob Wells reporting and Daryl Ruff scoring:

This year's IOM sailing started with an unstable weather bang that including power outages, trees falling, and rain/hail. Windfinder.com forecasted our winds at 4-6 knots with gusts in high 20's. I've been sailing IOMs regularly at Surprise Lake since 2010, and one think I've learned is big wind forecasts never materialize on this lake. So, I didn't bring my B rig because I've been conditioned to not trust those predictions. SURPRISE! Windfinder was spot on this time. Can't say I wasn't warned.

Picture us sailing in a light breeze and then a high-20's gust streak blackens the water and slams down any boat in its way, and then moves on. They don't last long, and they are very streaky. Then we're back to light air again. How do you tune for that? Mostly the gusts were from the south, but sometimes they dropped down vertically or from the north or east. Shifty is an understatement.

Soon we figure out how to sail upwind or reaching in most of the gusts by easing sails to depower, and then work the sheets as needed to add/lose power to keep moving. JWB was superior at this and so often at the front of the fleet. He credits his time sailing EC12s, which are often overpowered. They taught him to depower by footing a little and to manage the pressure by working the sheets to keep moving.

Except, downwind these gusts were too big to avoid a round up if they found you. Couple a big gust with a slowly moving IOM in light wind, and your bow is going down. Depowering techniques like hiding your jib behind the main were useless. On most downwind legs the gusts flattened us more than once, and then they're gone and you're in light air again slowly moving to the marks. The key was to recover from being flattened quickly and get on with racing.

There was carnage of course. Peter Conze had boat issues from the big winds from the git, and finally he found it too difficult to make repairs in this wind, so he went home to his shop early. Dennis Pittis was sailing his new *Malteaser2* for the first time, a nice-looking yellow hull with a lot of volume, and his new 808 sailwinch packed it in on the 2nd race. No problem because Dennis arrived with a backup *Alternative* with a B rig in place. Dennis finished the day mostly underpowered or looking golden in the gusts, and he did win an especially windy race. David's woody had his rudder horn disassemble, but then promptly fixed it and he didn't miss a start. David promised to add Loctite, so this issue doesn't repeat. David also promised to find/fix his woodies leak that he thinks is where the lid frame glues to the hull. Daryl Ruff made a similar promise – we'll see because this has been going on for a while now. I have a long list of things to fix before the next race,

including a badly bent mast crane from a crash (a gust induced collision) and an old jib to replace (same crash).

Daryl Ruff organized this regatta and set the course and David Jensen pulled the buoys, and many assisted putting things away. They have gates here now, and the passcode is 64999, so make a note.

The post-race lunch was just down the road at Acorn's Brewing, where the banter continued, but without JWB. We waited for him outside the clubhouse for a while by his boat, and then decided this was non-productive and headed for the pub. After we finished, Jerry saunter's in and explained he had been locked in the bathroom wing of the club house. No shit. Staff has locked up on a slow Saturday and left. Jerry got out only because an outside maintenance guy heard his pleas to unlock the door for him. He also showed Jerry the button to push to unlock for himself...

One of two VISS protos that performed very well at the 2023 Euros at Torrevieja, ESP. Zvonko Jelačić won and Ante Kovačević finished 5th for an excellent first major regatta for the VISS. Of course, these top sailors always do well at major international events, so there is that. Zvonko designed the VISS as an all-rounder that will perform better than the K2 in lighter winds. Innovations include a unique deck for end-plate effect, oval masts, and the rigs will fit the K2 (if you can afford both a heavy and light air boat). The VISS is intriguing because ZJ is an inventive designer that tests his new designs thoroughly before offering to the public. Initial impression is that this is one of the ugliest IOMs that I've seen, but if she is fast my taste will evolve to accommodate this deck shape for sure.
